

Deborah R. Klevans, Associate Coordinator of the WNU Summer Institute, was previously Director of Penn State University's Outreach Office of Program Development. She and her staff of instructional designers and adult educators worked with University faculty and other content experts to prepare innovative academic offerings for adult learners seeking continuing professional education.

Dr. Klevans was project director of Innovations in Distance Education, funded by the AT&T Foundation to support the development of quality distance education at universities throughout the United States. She led a Sloan Foundation-funded team of faculty in designing a new MBA degree delivered via distance education.

She served on the executive board of the American Association of Adult and Continuing Education; the Certified Provider Commission of the International Association of Continuing Education and Training; and chaired the AAACE Commission on Continuing Professional Education.

A developmental psychologist with an interest in adult development and behaviour change, Dr. Klevans received a Ph.D. in Human Development and Family Studies from Penn State. Also a licensed speech-language pathologist with a B.A. from the University of Michigan and M.S. from the University of Southern California, she taught courses, conducted research and supervised clinical practica at Penn State and elsewhere. She co-founded and directed a private counselling and clinical practice serving the needs of communicatively disordered individuals and their families.
