

Dr. Ted Lazo is in charge of radiation protection programs for the Division of Radiation Protection and Radioactive Waste Management in the OECD's Nuclear Energy Agency. His work has focused on radiological risk assessment and management, stakeholder involvement and risk governance, radiation protection policy and regulation, nuclear emergency management, occupation exposure at nuclear power plants, and decommissioning. He has been involved in radiation protection policy, regulation and standards since 1993.

His prior work experience included decommissioning at Three Mile Island, Unit 1, from 1980 to 1984 and environmental remediation for U.S. Department of Energy Sites in New Jersey in 1984-85. He also worked on accelerator and nuclear power plant radiation protection at Brookhaven National Laboratory from 1987 to 1991 and operational nuclear power plant radiation protection from 1991 to 1993 with Framatome and Electricite' de France (EDF).

Dr. Lazo obtained B.S. and M.S. degrees in Nuclear Engineering from the University of Virginia, and a Ph.D. in Health Physics from the University of Florida in 1989.
