

Phil McCullough is vice president of Training and Accreditation for the Institute of Nuclear Power Operations (INPO) and executive director of the National Academy for Nuclear Training in Atlanta, Georgia. In this position, Mr. McCullough is responsible for the industry's accreditation program, its leadership development courses and seminars, and its scholarship and fellowship program. He also has responsibility for the Institute's activities in the areas of organizational and human performance improvement.

Mr. McCullough became executive director of the National Academy for Nuclear Training in March 2002 and a vice president of INPO in March 2001. Previous positions include serving as director of Communications and serving as secretary of the Institute and assistant to the president. Joining INPO in 1981, he served in a variety of positions in the training and accreditation area. In 1989, he left INPO to join Florida Power & Light Company as manager of nuclear training, returning to INPO in 1992.

Mr. McCullough has an Ed.D. in educational administration from the University of Tennessee, a M.Ed. in educational counseling from Ohio University, and a B.A. in history and government from Capital University. He completed the Reactor Technology Course for Utility Executives at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and is a graduate of the Advanced Management Program, University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. He is also a member of the American Nuclear Society, the International Society for Performance Improvement, and the American Society of Training and Development.
